

UN Transforming Education Pre-Summit: Unlocking Transformation

Action Track 2 on Learning and skills for life, work, and sustainable development

Thursday 30 June 2020 10:10AM to 11:25AM CEST

Room II, UNESCO HQ, Paris, France

Background

- Recognizing that education is a foundation for peace, tolerance, human rights and sustainable development, the UN Secretary-General announced in his report to the UN General Assembly on 'Our Common Agenda' his intention to convene a <u>Transforming Education Summit (TES)</u> in September 2022. The Summit is aimed at mobilizing action, ambition, solidarity and solutions with a view to transforming education between now and 2030. The Summit is organized around focused, intensive, and inclusive preparatory processes including national consultations, thematic action tracks and public engagement and mobilization. The Summit will be an integral part and critical milestone in the roadmap of the renewed Global Education Cooperation Mechanism to accelerate progress towards SDG 4.
- In this context, a Pre-Summit will be organized in Paris on 28-30 June 2022. The overall objective of the Pre-Summit is to harness the evolving discussions on transforming education, elaborate initial content and establish shared vision and suggested actions for the Summit, and generate greater momentum in the lead up to September. A Global Engagement Day on 28 June will include technical meetings on Thematic Action Tracks and engagements with key stakeholders. The High-level segment consisting of Ministerial and Stakeholder engagement will take place from 29-30 June 2022.
- Action Track 2 of the Transforming Education Summit on 'Learning and skills for life, work, and sustainable development' addresses the following key issues: (a) foundational learning; (b) education for sustainable development, including environmental and climate change education; and (c) skills for employment and entrepreneurship, under the overarching tagline to: 'Empower learners for wellbeing, the future of work, and planetary sustainability by mainstreaming education for sustainable development.'
- In preparation for the Pre-Summit, three webcast consultations were held on Action Track 2 (two
 public, one for Member States) aimed at engaging diverse stakeholders to enrich the discussion in the
 draft discussion paper, to identify good practices and innovations that have produced practical and
 replicable results, and to mobilize new commitments and action by governments and other



stakeholders that will be discussed during the Summit. The following key elements of transforming education were identified in the discussion paper:

- Empowering learners for human and planetary sustainability by mainstreaming ESD: ESD is a cross-cutting instrument to empower learners at all levels of education and society, as well as a holistic approach to reinforce the interdisciplinary linkages of the three pillars of sustainable development: economic, social, and environmental. ESD networks should be strengthened at local, national, regional, and global levels, including for international cooperation in developing national capacities.
- Building and implementing robust foundational and lifelong learning policies and systems
 including investment in professional development through a whole-of-society and rights-based
 approach starting from the very early years of life into adult education.
- Promoting a whole-institution approach to learning, recognizing that learners and educators become meaningfully engaged in sustainable development by learning what they live and living what they learn.
- Addressing evolving skills demands in changing economies and transition to green and digital
 economies: Identify the new skills that will be required in the economies and societies of the
 future, such as literacy, digital literacy and citizenship, emerging technical and STEM skills; and
 competences for sustainability, civic and political engagement, and global citizenship; and
 innovation and entrepreneurship mind-sets.
- Ensuring inclusion, equity, and justice: All learners should be empowered with the knowledge, skills, values and attitudes required to address individual, economic and societal demands. Emphasis should be placed on removing barriers to learning for disadvantaged and vulnerable populations that are disproportionately affected by planetary crises such as climate change such as people living in extreme poverty, people on the move and displaced people, people with disabilities, people affected by conflict, crises and natural disasters, women and girls, indigenous people, minorities, people in rural areas.
- Strengthening governance and financing: Examine and develop innovative governance frameworks and financing mechanisms, focusing on new forms of inter-sectoral and publicprivate partnerships to foster quality and relevance of education.
- A 75-minute session on Action Track 2 is planned at the Pre-Summit on 30 June to discuss the critical
 elements that are necessary to transform education as well as the concrete actions that could drive
 the change.

Objectives

- Discuss the key components and actions for transforming education to empower learners in all stages of life for well-being, the future of work and planetary sustainability to inform the Secretary-General's Summit Summary and Call to Action;
- Mobilize commitments from Member States and key stakeholders in the lead up to the UN Transforming Education Summit in September in 2022.



Expected outcomes

- Key recommendations on transforming education for well-being, the future of work and planetary sustainability developed;
- Good practices, innovations, and examples of transformation initiatives with their transformative aspects compiled;
- Global initiatives, partnerships and coalitions that can mobilize cross-country cooperation and bring transformation to scale spotlighted.

Audience

The Action Track 2 event is open to diverse stakeholders including policy makers, practitioners, educators, young people, academics, civil society organisations, the private sector, media that are interested in transforming education, and particularly in the themes of foundational learning, skills for employment and entrepreneurship, and Education for Sustainable Development.
