2 Introduction

This is the annual report 2022 of the Stichting H.R.H. Princess Abze Djigma Foundation (also named: H.R.H. Princess Abze Djigma Foundation), an organization dedicated to supporting the accelerating of access to affordable and sustainable energy in developing countries and to reduce poverty by providing and deploying energy solutions to women and youth so they can further empower themselves while tackling climate change issues.

The Foundation is founded 23 May 2017.

The first years of the Foundation focused successfully on introducing the H.R.H. Princess Abze Djigma Foundation in the world H.R.H. Princess Abze Djigma was working. In 2019 has been focusing on extending the networks and to support the preparations of the further roll-out of the MAMA-LIGHT® Initiative for Sustainable Energy.

3 Background

The H.R.H. Princess Abze Djigma Foundation is a separate, non-profit organisation. It is an expression of H.R.H. Princess Abze Djigma commitment to stand her responsibility as an African Princess to improve the life of the women and youth of the bottom of the pyramid including the informal sector.

The H.R.H. Princess Abze Djigma Foundation primary focus is (to accelerate) the roll out of the MAMA-LIGHT® Initiative for Sustainable Energy, a Worldwide program that provides access to affordable and sustainable energy for women, small business and children. It empowers the informal sector; it drives the generation of new jobs and it creates a sound basis for gender equality and women empowerment. The program is selected by the United Nations at the Solutions Summit at UN General Assembly in 2015 as one of the 14 breakthrough solutions for achieving the Sustainable Development Goals.

The H.R.H. Princess Abze Djigma Foundation supports the implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG's) and helps the Least Developed countries (LDC's), the Land Locked Developing Countries (LLDC's) and Small Island Developing States in implementing the Paris Agreement with realizing their Nationally Determined Contributions (NDC's) and with the MAMA-LIGHT® Carbon Offset.

The H.R.H. Princess Abze Djigma Foundation is fully independent and run its programs with and within local communities in developing countries with selected global and local organisations.

5 Highlights 2022

5.1 Transforming Education Pre-Summit

June 2022

Recognising that education is a foundation for peace, tolerance, human rights and sustainable development, the UN Secretary-General convened aTransforming Education Summit (TES) in September 2022. The Summit was aimed at mobilizing action, ambition, solidarity and solutions with a view to transforming education between now and 2030.

In this context, a Pre-Summit was organized in Paris on 28-30 June 2022. The overall objective of the Pre-Summit was to harness the evolving discussions on transforming education, elaborate initial content and establish shared vision and suggested actions for the Summit, and generate greater momentum in the lead up to September. A Global Engagement Day on 28 June included technical meetings on Thematic Action Tracks and engagements with key stakeholders. The High-level segment consisted of Ministerial and Stakeholder engagement will take place from 29-30 June 2022. H.R.H. Princess Abze Djigma participated during the 3 days in different sessions and moderated the panel session "Learning and Skills for Life, Work and Sustainable Development" at the Pre-Summit Ministerial Segment on 30 June.

5.2 Botswana Global Adaptation Week

The Botswana Global Adaptation Week is one of the major adaptation events of the year which aims to showcase and promote actions and practices to adapt to the impacts of climate change. It offers a platform to raise adaptation ambition by accelerating the formulation and implementation of countries' National Adaptation Plans (NAPs) as well as foresight thinking for resilience.

H.R.H. Princess Abze Djigma participated at the NAP Expo and was one of the invited thought leaders in the Resilience Frontiers workshop, a first-of-its-kind UN interagency effort that moves the world's collective thinking beyond the dystopianparadigms created by today's challenges and into a desirable future of permanent resilience. The event brought together a diverse range of thought leaders for brainstorming meetings to help accelerate the journey towards this better world.

5.5 2022 UN Transforming Education Summit

Education today is in turmoil. More than 90 % of the world's children have had their education interrupted by COVID-19. The pandemic has also exposed large disparities not only between countries, but particularly between different learner groups within countries.

The Transforming Education Summit was convened in response to a global crisis in education – one of equity and inclusion, quality and relevance. Often slow and unseen, this crisis is having a devastating impact on the futures of children and youth worldwide.

The event brought together more than 2,000 participants over the course of three days, including 65 Head of States/Governments. The Summit has generated national and global action on how to make education fit for the future: inclusive, equitable, safe, resilient and geared to the collective crises and challenges we face, from widening inequalities to climate change, from protracted conflicts to the accelerating digital revolution.

H.R.H. Princess Abze Djigma participated actively during all three days in diverse sessions and moderated 2 high-level sessions:

5.6 African Union CIEFFA 5th Youth Capacity building workshop

African Union International Centre for Girls' and Women's Education in Africa (AU/CIEFFA) is a specialized institution of the African Union under the Department of Education, Science, Technology and Innovation. The Centre aims to promote girls' and women's education with a view towards their full participation in the eradication of poverty and the edification of a peaceful world for sustainable human development.

Youth from 40 African Union Member States, Traditional leaders from Burkina Faso, Eswatini and Cote d'Ivoire gathered from 1st to 4thDecember 2022 in Kigali, Rwanda for 5th Youth Capacity Building Workshop (YCBW) on Girls' & Women's Education under the theme "Girls and women's education, and climate change: connecting the dots to build sustainable and resilient communities".

Recognizing the important role that African youth play as change makers; both at grassroots and national levels in advocating for gender equality in and through education, the African Union CIEFFA since 2017 convenes young African women and men from African Union Members States working as advocates for girls and women's education (GWE) in their countries and local communities for an annual capacity building program.

This year H.R.H. Princess Abze Djigma, recognized as a champion of the Traditional Leaders, was one of the experts on advocacy and leadership skills to coach the selected 40 youth (one of each country) with a view of building a community of champions of education at national and community level, especially in the context of Climate Change.
